

### **Snowmobile Safety & Prep Tips**

- Fuel Stops: Plan your fuel stops in advance, especially when riding through remote areas.
- Trail Permits: Make sure you have the required trail permits for riding in Ontario.
- Safety Gear: Wear helmets, proper riding gear, and carry emergency kits at all times.
- Weather Check: Monitor weather forecasts daily.
- Trail Conditions: Always check the OFSC Interactive Trail Guide for up-to-date trail conditions before starting your ride.

## **Suggested Itinerary**

**Starting Point:** Kapuskasing **Total Duration:** 4 days / 3 nights



### **Day 1: Arrival in Kapuskasing**

The drive is long, but the thrill of snowmobiling in the Kapuskasing region is worth it!

- Check in at your hotel browse our list of accommodation partners.
- Discover Kapuskasing: dine at a local restaurant, get ready for tomorrow's ride, or unwind at the hotel.
- Restaurant picks: Chuck's Roadhouse,
   Papa Franco's, O'Brien's Bar & Grill,
   Bidule, and Chez Lizette.



#### Day 2: Ride to Hearst and back

Kapuskasing / Val Rita-Harty / Opasatika /
Mattice-Val-Côté / Hearst

# 242 km round-trip based on shortest route via TOP trails

- Set off on your snowmobiling journey to Hearst, about 121 km west of Kapuskasing.
   Enjoy stunning views of vast forests along the trail.
- Enjoy lunch at a local spot in Hearst.
- Suggested restaurants: Pizza Place, John's Restaurant, and the Companion Hotel-Restaurant.
- Ride back to Kapuskasing as you enjoy the well-groomed trails. Watch for local wildlife along the way!
- Fuel stops: OK Tire in Val Rita or Bob's Gas+ in Mattice.
- After a day of riding, enjoy dinner at a local restaurant and settle in at your hotel.

#### Day 3: Ride to Cochrane and back

Kapuskasing / Moonbeam / Fauquier / Smooth Rock Falls / Cochrane

# 318 km round-trip based on shortest route via TOP trails

- Ride east toward Cochrane, about 159 km from Kapuskasing, through diverse landscapes of frozen lakes, rivers, dense forests, and open fields.
- Fuel stops: Damco in Moonbeam and Smoothy's Esso in Smooth Rock Falls.
- Enjoy lunch in Cochrane, known for its Polar Bear Habitat. If time allows, visit the habitat and the Cochrane Classic Vintage Snowmobile Museum.
- Restaurant suggestion: 49th Parallel Kitchen.
- Ride back to Kapuskasing for your final night, taking time along the way to appreciate the breathtaking Northern Ontario winter landscapes. Don't forget to stop for a break at the Moonbeam Snowmobile Club des As.



### **Day 4: Return Home**

- Check out of your hotel and load up your snowmobiles.
- If time allows, swing by the Kapuskasing Welcome Centre near Tim Hortons to grab a souvenir or a cozy Kap hoodie as a keepsake of your adventure.
- Head home with unforgettable memories of your snowmobiling journey through the Northern Corridor.

## **Tourism Loops**

#### Lumberjack Loop (145 km)

The 145 km Lumberjack Loop takes snowmobilers through Moonbeam, Kapuskasing, Val Rita-Harty, and Opasatika, following the popular L123 trail. This route showcases the area's logging history, with trails through hydro corridors, old logging roads, and tree-lined paths. Watch for wildlife like lynx, moose, wolves, foxes, and rabbits along the way. The quieter southern stretch runs close to Highway 11, keeping food and fuel within easy reach.

The route starts in Kapuskasing on the A trail, heads west to L147, continues on TOP A West, loops through L123 in Moonbeam, follows L135, and returns via TOP A West to Kapuskasing.

### Missinaibi Expedition Tour (165 km)

The Missinaibi Expedition Tour offers a 165 km snowmobiling adventure along the historic Missinaibi River, once the main fur trade route between Lake Superior and James Bay. Starting in Hearst, this route winds through northern woodlands, past Mattice, with prime opportunities to spot moose and wolf tracks - so keep your camera handy! Ride some of the top trails in the province and immerse yourself in this scenic and historic landscape.

The tour follows TOP A to L159, L169, L163, L165, and continues through Mattice before connecting back to TOP A in Hearst.
